ART IN PUBLIC PLACES

History

- The Art in Public Places Act signed into law 1986.

Policy

- Designates 1% of appropriations exceeding \$100K for new construction or renovation (excludes infrastructure) are set aside for the acquisition of works of art.

Funds

- 1% of total eligible appropriation is automatically transferred to AIPP by the Department of Finance and Administration

IMPACT

More than \$30
million
Appropriated

- More than 30 million dollars has been appropriated for public art projects in New Mexico since 1986.

More 3,000
Artworks

- More than 3,000 artworks have been placed in all 33 New Mexico Counties.

More than \$6
million in funds

- AIPP has more than \$5.5 million in funds to spend.

STATE REVENUE

Funding Sources

- General Fund
- General Obligation Bonds
- Severance Tax Bonds

State Revenue

- Subject to legislative sweeps (2015 & 2016, 2016 Special Legislative Session, 2017, & 2020 Special Legislative Session)

IMPORTANT

Multiple Appropriations

- Sites that receive multiple appropriations over an extended period may consolidate AIPP funds for a single larger project.

No Expiration

- AIPP funds do not expire or revert

Reauthorized Funds

- When capital funds are reauthorized, AIPP funds stay with the original site, unless the site will not be built, then the funds become auxiliary.

ELIGIBILITY

Is your capital appropriation more than \$100K for a building?

Does the appropriation include language such as: “to plan, design, construct, renovate, equip and provide improvements?”

Your project is probably eligible for AIPP under state statute.

PROCESS

New Mexico Arts

Local Governments, Sites, Communities

AIPP works by region & notifies sites/communities of available public art funds

Contact us with questions about available funds & eligibility to move a project forward in your community.

PROGRAMS



DIRECT PURCHASE PROGRAM

- New Mexico, Regional, & National Artists
- Artworks juried by New Mexico stakeholders
- Artworks priced from \$1,000 - \$125,000, --depending on call
- Selected works are shown to potential buyers
- Process takes less than one year to complete

LARGE SCALE

- As Needed
- Artworks priced from \$35,000 to \$125,000
- Works tend to be larger to monumental in scale
- Open to regional artists & galleries (AZ, CO, NM, OK, TX & UT)


NATIVE & INDIGENOUS ARTIST INITIATIVE

- Offered for the first time in 2019
- Artworks are priced from \$1,000 - \$50,000
- Open to Native American, Native Hawaiian, and Alaska Native artists who reside in the United States as well as galleries in the United States

SITE SPECIFIC COMMISSIONS

- Work with a local selection committee
- Develop project intent for RFQ
- Review, interview, select artist/artist team
- More than \$100k projects
- Process can take 2-4 years.

COMMISSION PROCESS

- Local Selection Committee
 - Prospectus Development
 - Call for Artists
 - Online Jury Process
 - Finalist Selection
 - Finalist Presentations (up to five finalists)
 - Artist/artist team selected
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T.I.M.E.

- Temporary projects (90 days or less) in rural NM communities
- Smaller project budgets
- Open to New Mexico Artists
- Funded by the National Endowment for the Arts

NEW MEXICO ARTS PERMANENT COLLECTION

- Uses “auxiliary funds” from sites eligible for AIPP by statute but are not open to the public or are otherwise excluded.
- Selected from open calls
- More than 100 artworks
- Loans for 5-10 years
- Site insures the work during the loan period

HOW IT WORKS

- AIPP drafts contracts.
- Upon acceptance of an artwork AIPP pays the artist.
- Price of artwork is all-inclusive (framing, delivery, installation, & plaque)
- Site/owner agency owns the artwork (responsible for maintenance, restoration, repair, inventory, & insurance)
